bachelor thesis from the year 2016 in the subject pedagogy pedagogic psychology grade 10 manuel s enverga university foundation education course bachelor of secondary education language english abstract this descriptive type of research renders to assess and identify the factors that intervene with the level of critical thinking skills of grade 10 students of manuel s enverga university foundation candelaria inc the researchers identified two general factors namely the student factor and teacher factor student factors include two sub factors such as their attitude towards the subject and their learning strategies and styles meanwhile teaching strategies and styles art of questioning and instructional materials are included in the teacher factors there are one hundred eighty seven 187 respondents statistically drawn via systematic stratified random sampling to answer the following problems the researchers used an adapted test questionnaire known as the ceu lopez critical thinking test by dr marcos y lopez and the researcher made four point likert scale questionnaire the results revealed that the students are at the beginning thinker level it also showed that the five factors positively intervene with the level of critical thinking of students
